1971 MEDICAL EXPENSE CLAIMS

Employees are reminded that claims for medical expenses incurred during 1971 must be filed with Payroll no later than 90 days after the end of 1971. Each bill submitted for claim must show the following:

1. Name of the patient
2. A complete description of each service
3. The date of each service
4. The amount charged for each service
5. The diagnosis for each illness condition, unless shown elsewhere
6. The initials of the attending physician - if other than hospital or physician's bills or bills for drugs and medicines showing a prescription number.

RECORD \$166 MILLION Being Delivered in Saving Plans "Payout"

Some 181,000 participants will soon receive this multi-million-dollar "payout" from saving plans whose holding-periods ended December 31, 1971. The mailing of \$60.9 million in G. E. stock, \$65.8 million maturity value in U. S. Savings Bonds, \$38.0 million in S&S Program Mutual Fund Units and \$1.6 million in cash began today. The \$166 million is the largest "delivery" in the history of General Electric savings plans.
